Identification of victims

Identification of a victim is an initial point, where the preliminary interrogation of a victim shall start. This is a practical guide for identification of a victim.

For identification of a victim, a woman is considered a victim, if engaged in prostitution and meets one or more criteria for identification of a victim.

Five ethical principles remain important for identification of a victim, helping to collect evidence successfully – fairness, respect, competence, pragmatism and responsibility.

Primary criteria

- General indicators
- Prostitution process/ activity – organization
- Power, coercion, threatening

Secondary criteria

- Health indicators
- Well-being
- Freedom of movement and control
- Finance
- Other indicators
- Interviews/ meetings
