Research

- · Why do it?
 - Concern at lack of information on experiences of new communities
- · What we did?
 - Literature review
 - Focus groups people from new communities, employers and service providers
- · Key Question?
 - What research do we need to do?

Two factors underpin the need for research:

- The pace of change, with regard to migration and employment, social inclusion and equality, particularly in cities and large urban areas is difficult to monitor.
- We need well informed policy to achieve integration.

Results - Employers

- · People come for opportunity and family
 - Brings a richness of skill, culture and ability to the workplace
- · People come because of risk to themselves
 - Vulnerable groups, esp. when they cannot work
- · Benefits expand and broaden corporate intelligence
 - Improve customers services language
 - New markets
 - Diversity

Barriers

- · Literacy and levels of spoken english
 - Lack of practice with spoken word
 - Lack of access to classes
 - Colloquialisms and accents
- · Lack of access to Information
 - How things are done here
 - Where to get services
- · Lack of recognition of qualifications
- · Lack of access to referees

- · Visa system
 - Right to work
 - Complicated system
 - Lack of mobility
- Discrimination
 - Colour
 - Nationality
- Labour market segregation
- Exploitation
- Competitive labour market

Recommend - Research projects which:

- Build awareness of opportunity and benefits generated by diversity
- · Support best practice in accommodating diversity
- Provide guidance and support in promoting a healthy working environment

Service Providers

- · People come because of
 - Opportunity
 - Safe place to live and work
 - Good standard of living

Barriers

- · Right to work
 - Length of time waiting
 - Loss of contact with labour market
 - Under employed and de-skilling
- · Lack of recognition of qualifications
- Discrimination
- Exploitation causing tension between workers
- · Poverty traps
- · Lack of information
 - How things are done
- · Lack of networks

Recommend research projects which:

- Document and explain difficulties faced by certain groups people from accession states and outside EU - access to employment and promotion
- Explore the understanding and knowledge of Irish welfare system
- Monitor inclusion unemployment
- Efficacy of policy-making and efficiency of policies NB comparing initiatives that involve with those that do not involve people from new communities

People from New Communities

- Barriers
 - Language
 - Understanding labour market
 - Accessing labour market
 - Accessing information
 - Lack of understanding of cultural norms

- Visa and work permit system lack of knowledge of employers
- Lack of recognition and equivalency system for qualifications
- Lack of enterprise supports
- Lack of representation of migrants in policy making integration processes become barriers
- Lack of political representation
- Racism

Recommend research projects which:

- Assess the outcomes and benefits of integration programmes
- · Under-employment of people from new communities
- · Redundancy and under-employment in recession
- · Enterprise outcomes case studies

Interviewees recommend research into:

- Migrants experiences in accessing banking services and information on taxation issues
- Support needs of community development organisations to promote integration
- · Skills audits to address under-employment
- · Demographic profiles

Summary - need research which addresses diversity - esp gender, race and age - on a greater Dublin basis:

- The barriers to employment, housing, social networks, political participation;
- The impact of the visa and work permit system;
- Discrimination, racism and exploitation of people from new communities in Dublin, that is, access, participation and outcomes, to employment and services. NB Competitive labour market;
- The development of equality proofing systems, and monitoring mechanisms to ensure equal access, participation and outcomes;
- Identifying and describing **enterprise supports** required;
- Addressing the causes of **underemployment** of immigrants;
- Progression, we need to know more about the experiences of migrants over time in Dublin;
- Monitoring of $\boldsymbol{resources}$ for $\boldsymbol{supports}$ for migrants; and
- Assessing the outcomes and effectiveness of integration initiatives.
